In accordance with Section 953 of Title 49 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes, there is hereby submitted a fiscal and economic impact statement on the rule proposed for adoption, repeal or amendment. The proposed rule changes are not anticipated to have a direct material effect on state or local governmental expenditures. The proposed rule changes consolidate and condense the rules and procedures from several Office of Conservation (OC) departments that are found in different locations into a single location for a comprehensive compilation of procedural requirements for permitting, construction, operation, maintenance, plugging, and abandonment of alternative source wells installed for production of subsurface water containing greater than 10,000 mg/l total dissolved solids (TDS).


The proposed rule change will have no effect on revenue collections of state or local government units.

IV. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON COMPETITION AND EMPLOYMENT (Summary)


The proposed rule changes are not anticipated to have any impact on competition or employment.

There are no anticipated cost increases associated with the proposed amendment and all required documentation will be provided on existing paperwork.

The primary group impacted by these rule changes will be water well drillers proposing to drill a well that will produce subsurface water containing greater than 10,000 mg/l TDS. There are no anticipated negative impacts. There may be minimal positive impacts in that the proposed rule is intended to provide a more streamlined method of permit application and processing, saving the applicant some time and effort as compared to the current process.
