Dear Sir:

Attached herewith is an application for Work Permit covering a conversion of our J. J. Martin "B" #3, plugged and abandoned, into the Salt Water Disposal Well.

J. J. Martin "B" #3 was completed June 19th, 1941, and was abandoned on May 17th, 1943. The well was completed as follows: 10 3/4" 38.87# welded A. O. Smith casing landed @ 1040 and cemented with 600 sacks of Atlas cement. The oil string was 5 1/2" O. D. combination 17 x 15# J-55, and was landed at 6458 and cemented with 500 sacks of Atlas cement. In abandoning the well on May 17th, 1943, 150' cement plug was set from 6236 to 6386, and tubing was removed.

Our procedure to convert the well into a disposal well is to perforate from 1225 to 1275 w/6 shots per foot using 1/4" bullets. We then will go into the well with a 4" bailer and remove formation mud through the above perforated section.

You will perhaps be interested in knowing that we recently inspected the steel line and connections at our Rycade Salt Water Disposal Well, and found no evidence of corrosion. At the time of this inspection the well had been in operation for approximately three years, and some 925,000 barrels of water had been put through the line pipe and connections.
