LOCATION: **Plaquemines Parish, LA;** Approximately 2.5 miles from Port Sulphur, LA; Cox Bay Field; Lat 29° 32' 13.69"N / Long -89° 35' 26.96"W; See plats for proposed flowline coordinates.

DESCRIPTION: BOPCO is proposing to install five flowlines (6,234' in total) and construct a manifold platform (10' x20') in their Cox Bay Field. Approximately 1,339 cubic yards of native material would be excavated via jetting during flowline installation. Approximately 33 cubic yards of sand would be used at pipeline crossings and 15 cubic yards of rock would be utilized for bank stabilization.

REVISION 1: Request to extend permit term.

NOTICE the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, Office of Coastal Management (OCM) has received a request to extend the permit period for the above referenced Coastal Use Permit in accordance with the State and Local Coastal Resources Management Act of 1978, as amended, (Louisiana R.S. 49:214.21-214.41), and the rules and regulations of the Coastal Resources Program. The sole reason for not allowing extension based upon public comment shall be that there has been a change in the conditions of the area affected by the permit since the permit was originally issued. Comments should be uploaded to our electronic record, but may be mailed, faxed or emailed to the designated OCM Reviewer. All comments must contain the appropriate application number and the commenter's full name and contact information.
