**LOCATION:** **Plaquemines Parish, LA;** POB - Existing SL 212 H Well (K Sand Area 4 PUD) @ Lat. 29° 22' 39"; Long. -89° 47' 28"; POE - Existing LW 6700 Tank Battery @ Lat. 29° 22' 42"; Long. -89° 47' 07"; approximately 9.0 miles southwesterly of Port Sulphur, LA.

**DESCRIPTION:** Proposed installation of two 3" flowlines, approximately 1,900' in length, to serve the SL 212 H Well (K Sand Area 4 PUD). Approximately 748 cubic yards of native material will be displaced by jetting operations. Approximately 20 cubic yards of sandbag material will be used at flowline crossings.

**REVISION 1:** A request for extension of the initiation period has been received.

NOTICE the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, Office of Coastal Management (OCM) has received a request to extend the two year period for initiation of work for the above referenced Coastal Use Permit in accordance with the State and Local Coastal Resources Management Act of 1978, as amended, (Louisiana R.S. 49:214.21-214.41), and the rules and regulations of the Coastal Resources Program. The sole reason for not allowing extension based upon public comment shall be that there has been a change in the conditions of the area affected by the permit since the permit was originally issued. Comments should be uploaded to our electronic record, but may be mailed, faxed or emailed to the designated OCM Reviewer. All comments must contain the appropriate application number and the commenter's full name and contact information.
