COASTAL USE PERMIT/CONSISTENCY DETERMINATION

NAME AND ADDRESS: Dept. of Natural Resources, COASTAL MANAGEMENT DIVISION,
P.O. Box 44124, Baton Rouge, La. 70804.

LOCATION: LOUISIANA COASTAL ZONE, in the parishes of Assumption, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Lafourche, Livingston, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Charles, St. James, St. John the Baptist, St. Martin, St. Mary, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, and Vermilion.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The installation of pipelines* adjacent to manmade oil and gas well access routes.

*Pipelines are defined under this authorization as: Flowlines, pipelines, and gathering lines less than 6" in outside diameter. Under this general permit, pipelines, flowlines, gathering lines, or disposal lines which carry sulphur, caustics, or other hazardous or toxic substances are not authorized.

In accordance with the rules and regulations of the Louisiana Coastal Resources Program and Louisiana R.S. 49, Sections 213.1 to 213.21, the State and Local Coastal Resources Management Act of 1978, as amended, the permittee agrees to:

1. Carry out or perform the use in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by Department of Natural Resources.
2. Comply with any permit conditions imposed by the Department of Natural Resources.
3. Adjust, alter, or remove any structure or other physical evidence of the permitted use if, in the opinion of the Department of Natural Resources, it proves to be beyond the scope of the use as approved or is abandoned.
4. Provide, if required by the Department of Natural Resources, an acceptable surety bond in an appropriate amount to ensure adjustment, alteration, or removal should the Department of Natural Resources determine it necessary.
5. Hold and save the State of Louisiana, the local government, the department, and their officers and employees harmless from any damage to persons or property which might result from the work, activity, or structure permitted.
6. Certify that any permitted construction has been completed in an acceptable and satisfactory manner and in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by the Department of Natural Resources. The Department of Natural Resources may, when appropriate, require such certification be given by a registered professional engineer.
7. All terms of the permit shall be subject to all applicable federal and state laws and regulations.
8. This permit, or a copy thereof, shall be available for inspection at the site of work at all times during operations.
9. The following special conditions must also be met in order for the project to meet the guidelines of the coastal resources program:

OPERATING CONDITIONS

- a. This general permit provides for the installation, and maintenance of flowlines in spoil banks of manmade oil and gas field canals, between spoil bank/marsh interface and a point 20' marshward of that interface, in oil and gas field canal crossings, and along the berms (between the road and borrow ditches) of board roads. The installation of flowlines within 20' of the outside toe of a spoil bank/marsh interface is permitted provided that the pipe trench be completely backfilled after the pipe is laid (even if use of spoil bank material is required).
- b. Installation of pipelines* which carry salt water are authorized under this general permit; however, salt water must be disposed of in an approved manner and the applicant must obtain the necessary clearance issued by the Water Pollution Control Division of the Department of Environmental Quality for the disposal of salt water. Authorization to proceed under this general permit is not effective until such clearance is obtained.
- c. Work authorized under this general permit is minor therefore adverse impacts are reduced and the work is determined to be in compliance with Coastal Zone Regulations for activities having no direct and significant impact.
- d. No access channel or canal dredging to facilitate flowline installation is permitted under this authorization.
- e. Flowlines under this authorization are limited to pipelines less than six inches outside diameter.
- f. A standard Coastal Management Permit Application form must be completed and submitted, along with drawings describing the location, and character of work proposed for general permit approval to the Department of Natural Resources, Coastal Management Division before work may be performed. If proposed work is determined not to be within the general permit criteria, applicants will be advised that the application will be treated as an individual application.
- g. Work carried out under this general permit shall conform to all appropriate state and federal safety regulations.
- h. Applicant must agree to make every reasonable effort to perform the construction and work operations authorized by the general permit so as to minimize any adverse impact on fish, wildlife, and natural environmental values.
- i. If archaeological remains are uncovered during construction, the Louisiana Division of Archaeology will be notified immediately.



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- j. Applicant will notify the CMD/DNR upon commencement of work which is authorized under this general permit.

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THIS GENERAL PERMIT AUTHORIZATION DOES NOT APPLY IN THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

- a. In areas of submerged grasses and subaqueous or subaerial oyster reefs.
- b. Within boundaries of any state wildlife refuges and management areas, without the written consent of the Division Chief. (Authorization requests not accompanied by such written permission shall not be processed.)
- c. Within boundaries of any national park or monument, state park, and established buffer zone at a national park site.
- d. Within one mile of a known bald eagle nesting site.
- e. Within one-half mile of a known rookery area.
- f. Within the critical habitat of any endangered species.
- g. At or in close proximity to any known historic or archaeological site or within the boundaries of a historic district.
- h. Within any natural stream.
- i. Within any area subject to the jurisdiction of the State of La. Natural and Scenic Stream System.
- j. On barrier islands, barrier features, or cheniers.
- k. Within or near areas determined to be unique ecological features by the Coastal Management Division Administrator.
- l. In the parishes of Jefferson or St. Bernard.



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Copies of drawings showing typical pipelines* in oil and gas field canals and spoil banks are attached to illustrate the character of work proposed by this general permit.

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By accepting this permit, the applicant agrees to its terms, but reserves the right to appeal permit conditions.





