Dear Sir:

Application is hereby made on behalf of W & T Offshore, Inc., for the calling of a public hearing, after legal notice, to consider evidence relative to the issuance of an Order pertaining to the following matters relating to the 6700' Zone, Reservoir A, in the Breton Sound Block 20 Field, Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana.

1. To dissolve the existing reservoirwide unit designated as BRS20 6700' RA SU, which was created by Office of Conservation Order No. 255-E, effective January 1, 1973 and revised by Order No. 255-E-1, effective July 1, 1979.

2. Simultaneously with the dissolution of the unit referenced in 1. above, to create a revised reservoirwide unit (to be designated a BRS20 6700' RA SU), as shown on the plat attached hereto, for the exploration for and production of oil and gas from the 6700' Zone, Reservoir A, in the Breton Sound Block 20 Field, Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana.

3. To force pool, unitize and integrate all separately owned tracts, mineral leases, and other property interests within the revised reservoirwide unit, in accordance with the Subsection C of Section 5, Title 30 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, with each tract sharing in the unit production based upon the proportion that the productive surface acres in such tract bears to the productive surface acres in the entire unit.

4. To confirm W & T Offshore, Inc. as operator of said revised unit to be created hereby.

5. Except to the extent contrary herewith, to extend the provisions of Order No. 255-E, effective January 1, 1973, and Order No. 255-E-1, effective July 1, 1979 to the revised reservoirwide unit proposed herein.

6. To consider such other matters as may be pertinent.

The 6700' Sand, Reservoir A, was fully defined in Office of Conservation Order No. 255-E, effective January 1, 1973.


All pertinent data that is not otherwise available from the Office of Conservation can be obtained at the expense of the requesting party from the undersigned.

It has been determined that there is no necessity to confer about the proposal because there is no indication of opposition from any person to whom the pre-application notice must be sent, therefore no conference will be held and the Applicant hereby proceeds to file the application immediately without pre-application notice.

Enclosed is a check in the amount of \$755.00 made payable to the Office of Conservation submitted on behalf of the Applicant representing the hearing application fee.
