Dear Commissioner Welsh:

Application is hereby made on behalf of **CHESAPEAKE OPERATING, INC.**, for the calling of a public hearing, after thirty (30) days legal notice, to consider evidence relative to the issuance of Orders pertaining to the following matters related to the **Haynesville Zone, Reservoir A**, in the **Ten Mile Bayou Field**, DeSoto Parish, Louisiana, for which rules and regulations were established and a single drilling and production unit was created by Office of Conservation Order No. 572-B, effective November 18, 2008, to-wit:

1. To create one (1) additional drilling and production unit for the exploration for and production of gas and condensate from the Haynesville Zone, Reservoir A, such unit to be designated as **HA RA SUG**;
2. To force pool and integrate all separately owned tracts, mineral leases and other property interests within the proposed unit, with each tract sharing in unit production on a surface acreage basis of participation;

3. To designate Chesapeake Operating, Inc. as operator of, and a unit well for the proposed unit, if appropriate;
4. To provide that with respect to horizontal wells drilled to the Haynesville Zone, Reservoir A, within or to serve the proposed units, where the horizontal portion of the well is cased and cemented back above the top of the Haynesville Zone, Reservoir A, the distance to any unit boundary and any offset well(s) should be calculated based on the distance to the nearest perforation in the well, and not based on the penetration point or terminus;
5. To extend to the proposed unit, to the extent not inconsistent herewith, all pertinent provisions of Office of Conservation Order No. 572-B, effective November 18, 2008, as amended and supplemented by the 572-B Series of Orders, and all applicable Statewide Orders; and
6. To consider such other matters as may be appropriate and justified by the evidence presented at the hearing.

The Haynesville Zone, in the Ten Mile Bayou Field, DeSoto Parish, Louisiana, was previously defined in Office of Conservation Order No. 572-B, effective November 18, 2008.

A conference to discuss the proposed application and any opposition thereto was held at 10:30 a.m. on August 4, 2010, at The Onebane Law Firm, 1200 Camellia Blvd., Suite 300, Lafayette, Louisiana. A list of the parties who attended the pre-application conference is attached. Jeremy B. Shealy, attorney for the applicant, opened the conference with a discussion on unitization and the Rules of Procedure. David Comeaux, geological consultant for the applicant, explained the applicant's proposal and the geological, engineering and other bases therefor, and in a collaborative effort, Mr. Shealy and Mr. Comeaux answered questions. The conference was then adjourned. There was no opposition to the unitization proposal expressed at the conference. We anticipate there will be no opposition at the hearing.




