Dear Mr. Rice:

Sun has, just recently, been made aware of the proposed changes to the Scheduling Of Abandonment program and/or procedures. We feel the current program enables us to review and plan the expenses incurred with operating and maintain these inactive wells. A number of inactive wells, state wide, have future value to the mineral owners, working interest owners and the local and state taxing entities. In Sun's case, deeper well development has made it possible to more easily move equipment, repair and rework wells. New pipelines have opened up additional, closer to the wellhead gas markets. Oil and gas price fluctuations can greatly change the profitability of these wells. Drilling is ongoing today.

Sun is opposed to these new rules if no new Scheduling of Abandonments or extensions or renewals of existing SOAs are allowed. Obviously additional fees and other burdens levied on marginal and inactive wells reduce funds available to plug and abandon.
