
#### DECEMBER 2009

Natural gas prices are floating around \$5 per MMBTU for the winter months. The average price for September 2009 was \$2.78 per MMBTU. Gas prices are down because the expectation is that demand for natural gas will be flat in 2010 and then experience only limited growth in 2011 and 2012. The latest EIA 914 report, a lagging indicator of U.S. natural gas production, showed the largest drop in gas production since September 2008. It showed that production decreased by 2 percent in the lower 48 states in September 2009. The decrease is caused by a combination of natural gas plants being shut down for maintenance/repairs, and shut-ins due to low gas prices. Louisiana, however, showed an increase of 3.5 percent from August to September due to strong drilling in the Haynesville Shale formation.
